

Selected Hydrophyte Species of New York

Group A - Plants with leaves typically broad, all basal or arising from a floating or embedded rhizome or stem, the blades simple, more or less deltoid, sagittate, or elliptic.

1. *Nuphar advena* yellow water lily, spatterdock
2. *Nymphaea* spp. fragrant water lily, white water lily
3. *Nelumbo lutea* water lotus, American lotus
4. *Brasenia schreberi* water shield
5. *Pontederia cordata* pickerelweed, deer tongue
6. *Eichornia crassipes* water hyacinth
7. *Sagittaria* spp. arrowhead, wapato, duck potato
8. *Alisma plantago-aquatica* water plantain
9. *Peltandra virginica* arrow arum

Group B - Plants with submersed leaves dissected into narrow segments (plus some related species of *Ranunculus* and *Utricularia* with some leaves otherwise).

1. *Ranunculus* spp. water crowfoot, water buttercup
2. *Myriophyllum* spp. water milfoil
3. *Ceratophyllum demersum* coontail, hornwort
4. *Utricularia vulgaris* bladderwort

Group C - Plants small, completely free floating. Family Lemnaceae (Duckweeds)

1. *Spirodela polyrhiza* greater duckweed
2. *Lemna minor* lesser duckweed
3. *Lemna trisulca* star duckweed
4. *Wolffia* spp. watermeal

Group D - Plants with leaves all submersed; basal, opposite, or whorled.

1. *Najas* spp. naiads
2. *Valisneria americana* wild celery, eel grass, tape grass
3. *Elodea canadensis* elodea, water weed

Group E - Plants with leaves all or mostly submersed (some floating); alternate, simple.

1. *Zosterella dubia* (formerly *Heteranthera dubia*) water star grass
2. *Potamogeton* spp. pondweeds

Group F - Plants with leaves all narrow, basal, and mostly emergent.

1. *Typha angustifolia* narrow-leaf cattail
2. *Typha latifolia* broad-leaf cattail
3. *Sparganium* spp. burreed
4. *Iris* spp. iris (blue flag, yellow flag, etc.)

Group G - Monocots: three-ranked leaves (usually). Family Cyperaceae (Sedges)

1. *Scirpus* spp. bulrushes
 - a. *S. atrovirens* dark green bulrushes
 - b. *S. cyperinus* woolly bulrush
 - c. *S. validus* softstem bulrush
2. *Carex* spp. bristly sedges
3. *Cyperus* spp. umbrella sedges, nut grasses
4. *Eleocharis* spp. spike rushes
5. *Dulichium aarundinaceum* three-way sedge

Group H - Monocots: round stem, occasional leafing from base. Family Juncaceae (Rushes)

1. *Juncus effusus* soft rush
2. *Juncus tenuis (macer)* path rush

Group I - Monocots: two-ranked leaves; ligule on leaves where clasping stem. Family Graminae (Grasses)

1. *Phalaris arundinacea* reed canary grass
2. *Leersia oryzoides* rice cut grass
3. *Phragmites communis* reed grass
4. *Echinochloa pungens* barnyard grass

Group J - Rooted, emergent, marsh and shore plants. - *Herbaceous Plants*

1. Creeping plants, common to mudflats & margins
 - a. *Nasturtium officinale* water cress
 - b. *Ludwigia palustris* water purslane
 - c. *Elatine* spp. waterworts
 - d. *Lysimachia nummularia* moneywort
 - e. *Veronica anagallis-aquatica* water speedwell
 - f. *Myosotis scorpiodes* forget-me-not
2. Family Polygonaceae
 - a. *Polygonum* spp. buckwheat family
 - i. *P. cespitosum* smartweeds
 - ii. *P. coccineum* long-bristled smartweed
 - iii. *P. hydropiper* swamp smartweed, water smartweed
 - iv. *P. hydropiperoides* water pepper
 - v. *P. lapathifolium* mild water pepper
 - vi. *P. pennsylvanicum* nodding smartweed, pale smartweed
 - vii. *P. persicaria* Pennsylvania smartweed
 - viii. *P. punctatum* lady's thumb
 - ix. *P. orientale* water smartweed
 - x. *P. sagittatum* prince's feather
 - b. *Rumex* spp. tear thumb
 - a. *R. verticillatus* dock
 - swamp dock
3. Showy flowering plants
 - a. *Hibiscus palustris* swamp rose mallow, marsh mallow
 - b. *Epilobium* spp. willow herbs
 - c. *Asclepius incarnata* swamp milkweed
 - d. *Lobelia siphilitica* blue lobelia, great lobelia
 - e. *Lythrum salicaria* purple loosestrife
 - f. *Verbena hastata* blue vervain
 - g. *Impatiens capensis* jewel weed, touch-me-not
 - h. *Caltha palustris* marsh marigold
4. Family Lamiaceae
 - a. *Lycopus*
 - i. *L. unifloris* bugleweed
 - ii. *L. americanus* American water horehound
 - iii. *L. europaeus* European water horehound
 - b. *Mentha* spp.
 - i. *M. arvensis* field mint
 - ii. *M. aquatica* water mint
 - iii. *M. piperita* peppermint
 - iv. *M. spicata* spearmint
